House, Senate extend session to Dec 29 to ratify 2026 budget

The House of Representatives and the Senate will extend their session until December 29 to give way for the ratification of the proposed 2026 General Appropriations Bill (GAB).

House Committee on Appropriations chairperson and Nueva Ecija Rep. Mika Suansing said that on Monday, December 22, the House and the Senate will amend the Legislative

Calendar.

December 22 was supposedly the last day that the Senate and the House would hold sessions for this year.

While the House and the Senate were able to finish the deliberation last Wednesday night, Suansing said it would take five days for the secretariat to finish the report.

December 24 is a non-working holiday, while December 25 is a regular holiday.

Suansing said the De-

partment of Budget and Management (DBM) will review the changes made by the bicameral conference committee while the enrolled General Appropriations Bill (GAB) is being finalized.

“Simultaneous na po yung finalization ng enrolled bill ng GAB at yung review ng DBM.

Rest assured po, that the Executive is given enough time to review the GAB before the President signs it,” she said.

End ‘Bidding-bidding’: Adopt Singson Formula

able even if high project allocations are retained.

He explained that under the Singson formula—used during the term of former DPWH Secretary Rogelio “Babes” Singson—bids are automatically rejected if they are not, on average, at least 10 percent below the Approved Budget for the Contract (ABC), alongside an across-the-board price cut in the budget.

Leviste said Congress could include a special provision in the 2026 budget requiring DPWH contract prices to be at least 10 percent below approved budgets, noting that most DPWH bids currently fall only 0–5 percent below the ABC—an indication, he said, of possible collusion and bid-rigging.

He contrasted this with private-sector practice, where bids are typically 10–30 percent below approved budgets due to

genuine competition.

In a privilege speech delivered Monday night, Dec. 15, Leviste said the persistent overpricing of DPWH projects is driven by bid-rigging, citing reports that bids in some areas, including Batangas, are merely “bidding-bidding,” or staged bidding.

He also pointed to testimony from former DPWH Undersecretary Roberto Bernardo claiming that nearly all DPWH bids are rigged, as well as ongoing investigations into allegations that losing bidders receive up to 3 percent of contract values.

Leviste concluded that by adopting the Singson formula and rejecting bids that are not sufficiently below approved budgets, the DPWH can ensure at least P60 billion in savings in 2026 through genuinely competitive procurement.

FORMER Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) Undersecretary Maria Catalina Cabral found unconscious near the Bued River, about 20-230 meters below Kennon Road in Tuba, Benguet, Friday midnight, December 19.

Cabral was linked to the controversial flood

control project scandal.

Reports said that she asked her driver to stop at Camp 5, Kennon Road, and requested to be left alone.

Driver reported her missing; police later found her unconscious near the river.

Cabral was declared dead, 12.03 am by attending physician Dr. Gian

Frances Salinas.

She had recently been subpoenaed by the Independent Commission of Inquiry (ICI) regarding alleged anomalies in flood control projects.

Cabral was among officials accused of irregularities in multi-billion peso flood control projects.

The scandal involved alleged overpric-

ing, ghost projects, and misallocation of funds, which drew scrutiny from the Ombudsman and ICI.

Her death comes just days after she was formally summoned to testify about these anomalies.

Her passing may complicate ongoing investigations into DPWH's flood control program.
